

SPC approved report is presented to the SPA prior to submission to MECP by May 1st. A draft of the 2022 Annual Progress Report will be presented at the February meeting, with a final version being distributed via email for approval by the SPC.
- 6. Communications Update Christine Ropeter Report via email indicated that the Salt Responsibility Campaign has been running on social media and website from November 30, 2022, to March 8, 2023. Salt bin stickers shown to SPC and testing one at office salt/sand bin. Full distribution to be done at a later date and will include an inventory of the locations where they have been placed.
- 7. MECP Update provided by Conor Gamelin Source Protection Chair appointments are ongoing and no news for Sault Ste. Marie; Best Practice funding has two First Nations in negotiation (closest is Sagamok Anishnawbek near Massey); changes in ministry with regards to absorption of conservation policy section; annual reports from Ministries by February 1st to provide information to SPC for Annual Progress Report; Bill 23 changes to legislation with regard to Conservation Authority Act.
