#### 2.1.1 - Description

The SSMR watershed encompasses a land area of 522 km<sup>2</sup> and a total land and water area of 775 km<sup>2</sup>. There is one large municipal drinking water system within the watershed that serves the municipality of Sault Ste. Marie and Rankin residential area within the urban service line. The system draws water from both

surface and groundwater. There is one surface water intake in Lake Superior and six groundwater wells in four locations within the watershed. Details of the Source Protection Area physical properties can be found in the Assessment Report. The population outside of the urban service line and the Township of Prince are outside the scope of this source protection plan but is addressed by MECP with the Best Practices documentation and guidelines (https://www.ontario.ca/document/best-practices-source-water-protection).

The City of Sault Ste. Marie municipal water supply is a large municipal residential system under O. Reg. 170/03, servicing a population of over 74 000 and drawing approximately equal quantities of groundwater from its municipal wells and surface water intake.
